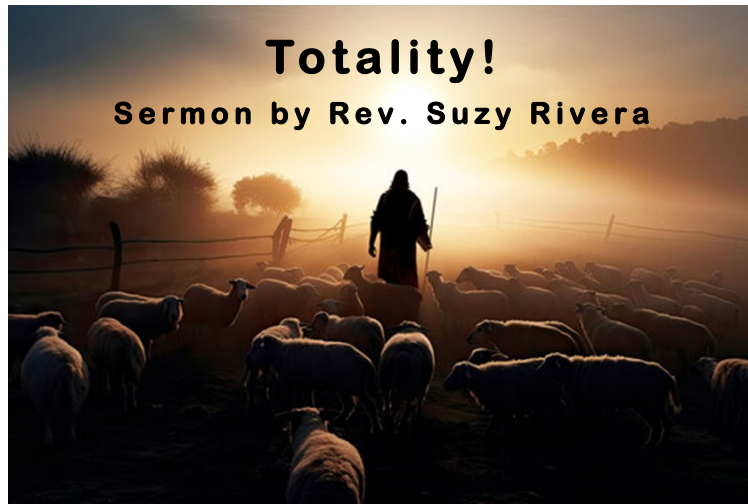

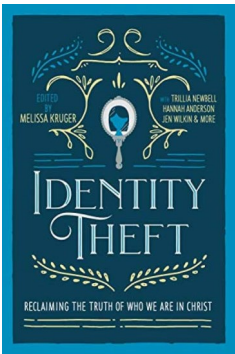
PUMPKIN PATCH

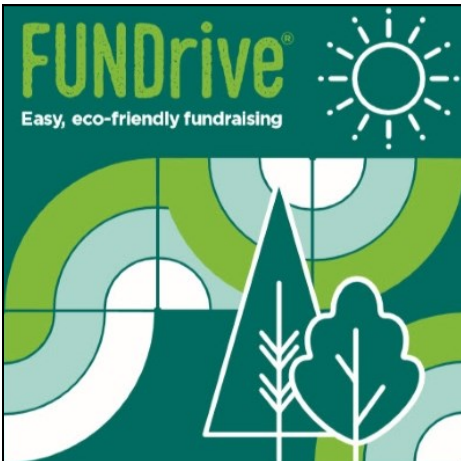

200th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION CORNER

200 Years of Food, Festivals and Fun

Early on, church records indicate we often gathered with our congregation and local community to raise money. Before the modern convenience of restaurants and food delivery, our church provided opportunities to dine outside the home with friends and neighbors. On February 2, 1913, the Ladies Aid Society held a supper in the Grange Hall next door that raised \$9.83. Later that month, they sold tickets to a Red and Blue Valentine Social. A Harvest Supper and Fair was discussed in 1921 and held annually. Over 200 were served at its turkey supper in 1941 that made \$170. A December 1939 turkey supper was preceded by a program of Christmas carols on the chimes. Hence turkey was the main course of the Heritage Celebration Dinner this past March. Board meeting notes mention roll call suppers from 1925–1951 to raise money for coal.



The Women's Society of Christian Service cooked and served weekly dinners for the Rotary Club, starting at the original Main Street church and continuing after the move to Prospect Street. We have had years of Methodist Youth Fellowship pasta dinners, preschool pasta dinners, fall Yankee pot roast meals, and spring chicken and ham dinners.

The first strawberry festival was held in 1961 and grew larger year by year until 1996. An early morning team picked, hulled, cut and sugared berries, bakers made shortcake, cream was whipped, chicken was barbecued, and potato salad and coleslaw prepared. Volunteers found their role and team leaders depended on them every year. Reservations became necessary for this sold-out event. Hungry diners waited in the sanctuary and were led in hymn singing until a table was available. Somehow, this happened in a small kitchen, now the education resource room and Old Fellowship Hall.

Seasonal fairs were common and the December Christmas Fair became the largest. It was a full weekend event with early coffee and donuts, a clam chowder sandwich luncheon and ham dinner. Booths sold candy, baked goods, cheese, ceramics, white elephant items, jewelry, and the craft goods and holiday decorations the ladies groups had made throughout the year. Holiday decorations and music with Santa-hatted volunteers made it fun for the church and community that supported us. Our first fall flea market craft fair netted \$910 in 1982. Our first pumpkin patch in 2018 raised \$2,700 and has grown into a major fundraiser. It requires many volunteers who unload the pumpkin delivery truck, set up and oversee daily sales for all of October. Profits are shared with the southwest Native Americans who grow the pumpkins. The craft fair attracts the community to buy pumpkins, browse the vendor booths, take photos and eat a hot dog lunch.

Musical shows and plays were a large part of fundraising in the 1900s. This was before TV and movies, and access to big city entertainment and sporting events. The flyer for an Entertainment for the Benefit of the M.E. Church, held on January 31, 1900 at the next-door Grange Hall, is posted on the bulletin board near the Old Fellowship Hall. It featured a piano solo, recitation, scarf drill, zither and vocal pieces. I recognize the names of performers from church board meeting notes. Also posted is a program held on April 4, 1924 for A Bunch of Fun Comedy presented by our Epworth League, a young adult Methodist organization. The cast appears to have been church members, directed by Miss Gertrude Beebe of Miss Coe's School of Oratory.

After the Hubawi Club, a group of church husbands and wives, reported on money raised by a recent play on June 6, 1932, notes indicate that "Pastor Bergston spoke at some length on religious pantomimes, saying he hoped they would in no sense be taken as entertainment but were put on purely for worship and education." Hubawi also presented an Olde Folks Concert and two plays in 1932, and three minstrel shows in 1940 and 1941. The last minstrel show drew over 600 to Wethersfield High School. The event made \$650, which was used for repairs after the 1941 church fire. The Krazy Kapers of 58 Variety Show raised \$878 in 1958 for the fund to build the Prospect Street church. The MYF held talent show fundraisers, proving year after year that we enjoy making each other laugh and a few of us have actual talent to share. A runway fashion show featuring rummage sale rejects was a highlight.

Special choir and music performances are now given more to praise God with the gift of music than to raise money. The most recent was our 200th Anniversary Concert in front of the church on May 4, 2024. All of these projects require volunteers and leadership and are valuable opportunities for fellowship and community outreach. For 200 years, we have supported our church with our prayers, gifts, service and witness.

Our new pastor, Rev. Dr. Marion Ryan Hubbard

As of July 1, our new pastor will be Rev. Dr. Marion Ryan Hubbard. She had previously served with us back in 2021 for 4 months while Rev. Beckford was on leave. Listed below is her biographical information



Rev. Dr. Marion Ryan Hubbard is a member of the New York Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church with 20 years of service in parish ministry as an ordained Elder. She has served as a pastor to seven churches in the New York Annual Conference. She earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology from Post University. She also holds a Master's of Divinity and a Doctor of Ministry degree from Drew University. Her doctorate dissertation was "A Guide to a Faith-Based Support Group for Adults Who Personally Experienced Childhood Trauma."

Marion has done extensive work in ministry in Ghana, Africa. In her ten years of service to the Ghanaian people, she was a co-founder of the Project Dorcas Medical Clinic in the north of Ghana in Tamale, bringing much-needed medical assistance to the wonderful people of the rural Yapalla Village and surrounding areas. She has also been a part of the Kairos International prison ministry team serving over 10 years in the Connecticut prison system.

Being a New Yorker, born and raised with a love of adventure, has taken her on many exciting journeys with God at her side. She has traveled to many

states across the U.S. and around the world including Korea, China, India, Turkey, Jerusalem, Germany, the Czech Republic, England, Ireland, and Scotland.

In 1981, Marion became a single mom and left New York City with her three children and settled in Bethel, CT. As God would have it, twelve years later, the love of her life appeared, and she married for a second time to a wonderful man, Robert Hubbard. Between them, they have ten children and twenty-one grandchildren. They were married for 31 wonderful years until Bob's passing this past January from Dementia. In 2018, Marion retired from active ministry at the New York Annual Conference to take care of her husband who developed dementia. For the past six years, they have lived in Tequesta, FL, and attended First United Methodist of Jupiter, FL. She has been active in her local United Methodist church, serving wherever needed, preaching on occasion, visiting the shut-ins, and running Bible studies and support groups during the year. She is currently working part-time as a Counselor for Community Christian Counseling Center.

Her mother always stated, "Going out with Marion is like going on an adventure; you never know where you will end up." Pastor Marion is so excited to be joining us again to continue the journey of bringing God's love to Wethersfield and beyond.
