Wordly Women Fall Study: Revelation - Eternal King, Everlasting Kingdom, by Jen Wilkin

Perhaps no other book of the Bible feels as inaccessible and as intimidating to us as the very last one. The book of Revelation overflows with images and ideas that confound our modern ears. 

200th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION CORNER

UMARMY/United in Missions

United in Missions, originally known as United Methodist Action Reach-out Mission by Youth (UMARMY), was founded in Texas in 1979 by Houston Methodist Churches. When Texans Bill, Sherri and Stacey Brown lived in Connecticut and were part of our church, they took a team of 12 of us to participate in a UMARMY camp in Paris, Texas, in 2002. In the summer of 2003, our mission committee coordinated and attended the first Northeast Regional Camp at the Nichols Church in Trumbull, Connecticut. WUMC is proud to have introduced UMARMY to the East Coast. Today, the organization is active in all New England states, as far south as West Virginia, and from Texas to Louisiana and Mississippi. There are four regional offices.

The purpose of this growing Christian outreach is "to provide Christ centered missions that serve people in need and promote spiritual growth and leadership development in youth and



young adults." Low income, elderly or disabled clients are found by the host church, and pre-site visits are made to assess supplies and labor needed to do home repairs, painting, yard cleanup, and wheel chair ramp construction, free of cost to the homeowner. Relationships are fostered with clients through on-site visitation and lunch devotions, and a dinner-night end-of-week worship with campers and clients.

Multiple leadership opportunities for youth include managing a devotional team, overseeing safety concerns, tools and materials, food and recreation activities, and navigating to worksites. Teams are formed, blending people from several churches and towns. The national organization provides detailed guidelines to adult leaders, drawing on the experience of over 40 years of camps. A yearly camp theme, with materials for worship, is provided. The days are structured with morning and evening devotion, prayer and reflection time, meaningful messages, and heartfelt music. Days are spent working at your team project site, and evenings bring organized recreation and team fun competitions.

Nationwide, over 100,000 participants have repaired 50,000 homes. Funding is from participants' fees, individual donations, fundraising – such as our regional golf tournament this summer – corporate donations, and gifts of materials and food to each camp. Campers depend on the hospitality of the host church, and WUMC has been able to provide the always appreciated air conditioned space, ample sanctuary and kitchen many times. The congregation assists with providing, preparing and serving the first night's dinner, and has been welcomed to camp worship and client night programs. The walls of our Cool Jude Youth Room showcase many group photos of campers. Take a look to see how our youth has grown; some have become the adult camp leaders and join the others who consistently serve in this exceptional Christian outreach. My thanks to Judy Dowd and the UMARMY website for the information shared here. We look forward to this year's campers sharing their experience with us at worship soon.
